Kisumu, Kenya Aug 26-Sep 6


Provide health care and education to rural communities. Healthcare professionals are needed



St. Herman of Alaska Wonderworker of All America

It's appropriate that we honor the 50th anniversary of the canonization of Saint Herman in this special Teams-focused issue of Mission, because the Saint himself came to the North American mission field as part of an Orthodox missionary team! In 1794, he and six other monks from Valaam Monastery in Russia traveled over 7,000 miles to Kodiak, Alaska, where they taught and baptized the native Alaskans. Life there wasn't easy, and soon Herman was the only surviving monk. He built a hermitage on Spruce Island and called it New Valaam. He performed many miracles, and others were recorded after his repose in 1837. Herman was glorified as the first North American saint in August, 1970.



The 5 Steps to being an OCMC Team Member

We love to tell you about the OCMC Mission Teams you’re supporting, and the amazing experience team members have in the field. Teams are a great way for everyone to serve in missions! Have you ever wondered what it’d be like to be on a team? Here are the steps of a Team member’s journey.

1. Apply

Submit a Missions Team Application (available at ocmc.org) and clergy reference.

2. Train

Once your application is accepted, you’ll go through orientation — a time of training, preparation, and team building. The specifics of your training depend on your Team assignment.

3. Share

Tell family, friends, those in your church and community about the work you will be doing, and raise funds for support. We will help you do that effectively.

4. Go

You and your teammates will serve others and experience a new culture while offering a witness to the Faith.

5. Witness

Once you return home, share your knowledge with others, and if they feel called, encourage them to join an OCMC Mission Team too! (engage in missions and sharing Christ’s love)
