

### North Star of Christ's Holy Church

On August 9, we commemorate our venerable father Herman of Alaska, one of the first Orthodox missionaries to North America and the first saint to be glorified by the Orthodox Church in America. All of us in the mission field (which includes you, thanks to your partnership with OCMC!) should find inspiration and strength in his example.

How wild, distant, and foreign Alaska must have seemed when he and his brother monks came to America from northwestern Russia in 1793! But he quickly became beloved by the local Aleutian Islanders, as he lived a life of extreme simplicity and self-denial, sharing the Gospel with them until his death in 1837.

The natives called him Apa ("grandfather"), but in his Troparion he is remembered as the "north star of Christ's holy Church." Much more information about his inspiring life can be found online. O Holy Father Herman of Alaska, pray to God for us!

Your support of the Orthodox **I** Christian Mission Center helps OCMC missionaries share the Faith in places where those who call themselves Orthodox are a minority. The story of a brave young woman named Joanna shows the challenges Orthodox Christian teens face in some villages in Albania!

The Orthodox Church of St. John the Baptist stands in the center of the village of Krokra. Dcn. Stephanos and Dkn. Alexandria

Ritsi have been ministering here for four years. The church's regular priest serves multiple congregations and lives 90 minutes away by bus, so the Ritsis and students from the seminary in Albania visit as often as they can!

Through God's grace, their church has a growing group of youth and young adults as members. Many of them come from atheist or Muslim families — and while their parents have consented to their children

receiving baptism as Christians, it can be extremely hard for a young person from one of these families to live an Orthodox Christian lifestyle.

Joanna was one of the most popular and talented members of the St. John the Baptist youth group. Her parents did not support her in her new Orthodox lifestyle, but she did her best to attend every liturgy and event she could.

Then, Joanna's parents discovered she had been speaking

# So many new believers, the priests ran out of chrism!

Your support of OCMC touches lives all over the world. Then, like ripples in a pond, those lives influence others, and so on, and so on. That's what it means for the Church to be one Body!

In Guatemala, for example, OCMC missionaries regularly train local Orthodox believers to be lay leaders and evangelists. They, in turn, spread out throughout Guatemala and southern Mexico, sharing the Gospel and

teaching members of remote rural parishes. It was through the work of those lay leaders that, last spring, Fr. Daniel Muxtay chrismated more than 150 new Orthodox Christians at his church in Pebilpam, Guatemala.

Our friends in Guatemala and southern Mexico report that right now, there are over 300 additional people still waiting to be chrismated. The Church is growing so quickly, in fact, that after the chrismations in April, Fr. Daniel and his colleagues had to send an urgent petition to their archbishop for more chrism to be delivered!

We hear she is trying to live her Orthodox Faith in secret, but with no contact with other believers, it is getting harder and harder to do.
