Peter was a fisherman from Bethsaida in Galilee, brother of Andrew the First-Called. He was called Simon, but was renamed Peter by Christ Himself. He was with Christ from the earliest days of His earthly ministry, and although he denied Christ three times before His Crucifixion, he was forgiven and went on to preach the Good News in Judea, Antioch, Rome, and elsewhere. Paul was an educated man from Tarsus who persecuted the early Church until Christ Himself called his name on the road to Damascus. Paul preached throughout the Mediterranean world, and more than a dozen of his Epistles are in the New Testament. The Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, one of the most important dates on the Church calendar, commemorates the martyrdom of these two great Saints in Rome during the reign of Emperor Nero.

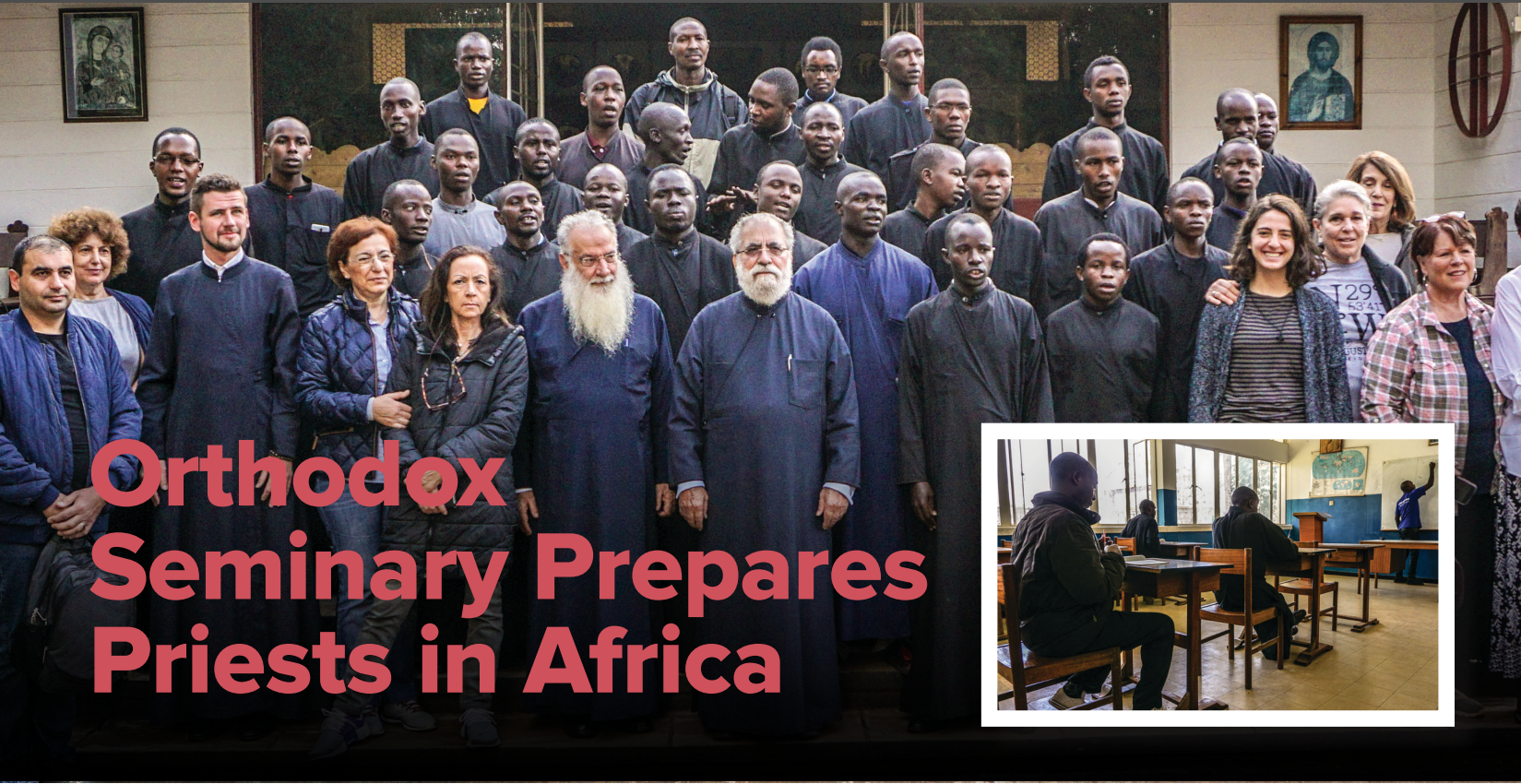
Kontakion of Apostles Peter and Paul in the Second Tone

Orthodox Seminary Prepares Priests in Africa

If there has been one institution that has been vital to the spread of the Holy Orthodox Church in Africa, it might just be the Makarios III Seminary (officially called the Orthodox Patriarchal School Archbishop of Cyprus Makarios III) in Nairobi, Kenya. Since its founding in 1981, many dozens of students have studied there, not only from Kenya, but

from countries across Africa. Today, priests who trained at the Seminary are shepherding flocks all over the vast African continent. His Grace Bishop Neofitos of Nyeri and Mount Kenya is also a Makarios III graduate. Here's something else you should know about the Seminary: it trains these young men for the priesthood at little or no cost. The

Seminary depends on donations from Orthodox believers to keep its doors open — and for several years, much of those funds have come from you, through your generous support of the Orthodox Christian Mission Center! You're Training Future Priests in Albania

With your help, the Albanian Church is recovering from decades of oppression

The Orthodox Faith came to Albania early in the Church's history. Today, almost 20% of the Albanian population is Orthodox, but the priesthood and diaconate are still recovering from decades of Communist dictatorship and official atheism. You are helping raise up a new generation of Church leaders in Albania.

That's because your generous giving to OCMC helps makes possible the classes offered by the Theological Academy "Resurrection of Christ" in Shen Vlash, Durres, Albania. Hundreds of students have graduated from the Academy since it was founded in 1992. Many of Albania's current bishops and priests have attended the school, which educates both men and women.

Thanks to you, several OCMC missionaries have been able to teach at the Theological Academy over the years, leading classes in Church history, patristics, English missions, and other subjects.

We estimate it costs about \$830 per student per year to provide an OCMC missionary to the Theological Academy to help train promising Albanian believers for leadership positions in the Church. Even if you never set foot in Albania yourself, you are helping rebuild the ancient Albanian Church through your partnership with OCMC!

How You're Sharing the Faith in Remote Guatemala

In a Church hungry for leaders, you're helping catechists meet a vital need

The Orthodox Church in Guatemala has about 40,000 members spread across 150 remote and mountainous parishes ... and five priests.

You read that right: Five.

Because of your support, these priests are not alone. Your generosity makes possible the training of several hundred catechists in villages and towns across Guatemala. And while these catechists — often village elders and other community leaders — cannot perform the sacraments and are themselves still learning about the Church, they are, as Fr. John Chakos says, "the backbone of the Orthodox Church" and the key to its continued growth.

With your help, the OCMC assists in the training of these catechists, helping them grow in their knowledge and love of the Lord, and equipping them to share what they learn with members of their parishes. It costs as little as \$155 to provide a catechist with the training he needs to teach the Faith in his village.

You are also helping the Guatemalan Church recruit and train qualified candidates for the holy priesthood. Thank you for your continued support of the Church in Central America!
